Historical Tours and Attractions



Tour of Leavenworth's Victorian Carroll Mansion with Guide

1128 5th Avenue Leavenworth, KS

Open: Tuesday-Saturday, 10:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

A visit to this mansion is like taking a step back in time. This 1867 Victorian home features elaborate handcrafted woodwork throughout the house, beautiful stained glass windows and elegant antiques from the Victorian era and early 20th century.

Tour length: 1 hour

Cost: \$10 per person, payable to the LCHS (Leavenworth County Historical Society)



Tour of Leavenworth with Step-On Guide Available daily with reservation for groups of 20+

Tour the "First City of Kansas," established in 1854. Points of interest include restauranteur Fred Harvey's former home, the Carroll Mansion and numerous other historic homes, as well as sites connected to President Abraham Lincoln and Susan B. Anthony, the renovated 1888 Union Depot, Leavenworth National Cemetery and the "Big House," the United States Federal Penitentiary — drive by only!

Tour Length: 1 hour

Cost: \$40 flat fee payable to tour guide



C. W. Parker Carousel Museum

320 S. Esplanade Street Leavenworth, KS

Open: Saturday and Sunday, 1-5 p.m.

This museum features a newly restored, fully operational 1913 C.W. Parker Carousel, originally made in Leavenworth by the C.W. Parker Carousel Amusement Company. It was created during the period when this company was internationally famous for its unique and creative carousels and associated amusement devices.

Also on display is the oldest primitive carousel in the United States and a 1950s aluminum Paul Parker Carousel.

Tour & ride length: 1.5-2 hours

Cost: \$5 per person for groups of 20 or more



28 Blocks of Historic Downtown Shopping Broadway Street to 7th Street

This shopping district is filled with family-owned and veteran-owned small businesses. Located here are more than 75 restaurants, boutiques, antique dealers, salons, spas, theaters for both movies and live shows, museums, parks, pubs, breweries and a wine tasting room.

Historical Tours and Attractions

Richard Allen Cultural Center

412 Kiowa Street Leavenworth, KS Open: Monday-Thursday 11-4 p.m., Friday 11 a.m.-3 p.m., Saturday by appointment only

This museum offers a glimpse into African-American history, both local and nationwide. Visitors can learn about important "firsts" and other accomplishments of the African-American community as well as view memorabilia from General



Colin Powell, the famed Buffalo Soldiers — including the only known female cavalry member, Cathay Williams — and former slaves.

Tour length: 1 hour

Cost: \$6

Ask about extending the tour to a former stop of the Underground Railroad. Additional fees apply.



National Fred Harvey Museum 620 Olive Street Leavenworth, KS

This museum will be housed in the former home of celebrated restauranteur Fred Harvey and will feature artifacts and memorabilia of the Harvey family as well as the world-famous chain of Harvey House hotels and restaurants and their star attraction, the Harvey Girls. The museum is under renovation at the present time but welcomes tour groups by appointment.

Tour length: 30 minutes Cost: \$5 per person

Reception at hotel upon check-in. Available to groups of 20 rooms or more. Ask CVB staff for details.

A member of the Convention and Visitors Bureau or a CVB ambassador will welcome your group to town and have fresh coffee and cookies for your group — and possibly goodie bags.



FUN OPTION: A barbershop quartet dressed like convicts entertain during one of your meals, only \$40.

Everyone can have their picture taken behind a Leavenworth jail front. Include it in your Christmas card letter to show the family what you did this year!



First City Museum

743 Delaware Street Leavenworth, KS

Open: Thursdays only, 1-4:30 p.m.

A quaint collection of early frontier memorabilia and artifacts. Also on display is a large mock-up of the "Big House," the U.S. Federal Penitentiary, which is the next best thing to touring the prison—and a lot less walking!

Tour Length: 1 hour Cost: \$5 per person

Historical Tours and Attractions on Fort Leavenworth


Tour of Fort Leavenworth with Step-On Guide Available daily, contact the CVB for reservations



Welcome to one of the oldest forts in the nation, in continuous operation since it was founded in 1827. Fort Leavenworth played a major role in keeping the peace among various Native American tribes and the increasing number of settlers heading West. Among the numerous historical sites is a visible cut in the terrain made by heavily laden wagons on their journey west along the Oregon and Santa Fe Trails.

Tour length: 1 hour

Cost: \$40 payable to tour guide



Buffalo Soldier MonumentGrant Avenue
Fort Leavenworth, KS
Open daily to the public

This monument honors the U.S. Army's 9th and 10th Cavalry Regiments, comprised of black soldiers known as "Buffalo Soldiers." General Colin Powell had the initial idea and gained support for a formal monument while stationed at the fort, and was a guest of honor at its 1992 dedication.

Tour Length: 30 minutes

Cost: There's no cost to visit, but costumed re-enactors are available to speak to your group for a fee; contact the CVB for more information.

Frontier Army Museum

100 Reynolds Avenue Ft. Leavenworth, KS

Open: Tuesday-Friday, 9 a.m.-4 p.m.

Saturdays, 10 a.m.-4 p.m.

This museum showcases the Army's role in the western expansion of the U.S., featuring world-class exhibits like "Beyond Lewis & Clark: The Military Exploration of the American West." Your group will see the carriage Abraham Lincoln traveled in when he visited the area, the sleigh owned and used by George Custer while stationed at Fort Leavenworth, a Conestoga Prairie Schooner dating from 1790 and a 1917 JN4D "Jenny" bi-plane.

Self-guided tour length: 45 minutes Cost: Suggested donation of \$4 per person

Lunch with the Harvey Girls

123 S. Esplanade Street (913) 758-2948

Catered meals served by ladies dressed as the world-famous Harvey Girls in the Riverfront Convention and Community Center, housed in the historic 1888 Union Depot. Available for groups of 25 people or more, though a twoweek advance notice is required.

Menu: Prices start at \$15.25 per person (tax and tip included). Several menu options are available, including BBQ buffets.

Karma Bakery & Deli 223 S. 5th Street (913) 250-5213

Grab-and-go sandwiches and salads, plus daily lunch specials. Save room for a cupcake, since 16 varieties are baked fresh daily!

Menu: Turkey wraps and chicken salad sandwiches are popular options for groups on the go; contact the CVB for current pricing.

TenPenny Restaurant and Bar 529 Cherokee Street (913) 651-1010

This eating establishment features chicken fried steaks, burgers, sandwiches, salads and other American pub fare. It's a popular spot for watching the big game thanks to their many TVs, especially Monday through Thursday during a favorite local event: \$5 happy hour appetizers. A private room also is available for small meetings and other events.

Menu: For lunch or dinner, try a specialty burger for around \$7. The "Skinny Penny" menu offers healthy grilled options like shrimp, salmon and chicken from \$9 to \$18.



(913) 297-0361

Housed in a 1887 Santa Fe Depot listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Great breakfasts, lunches and Sunday brunches. Don't miss out on the pulled pork, a blue ribbon winner in a local BBQ contest!

Menu: For breakfast, choose a platter of eggs, bacon, hash browns and The Depot's signature donut muffin; for lunch, opt for the bacon-wrapped meatloaf with a side of mashed potatoes, gravy and crispy brussel sprouts. Inquire ahead about group menus and pricing.

Restaurants/Dining/ Meals/Costs

The Suburban 402 S. 20th Street (913) 364-5003

Cozy neighborhood restaurant with a gorgeous patio, now serving American classics with an upscale twist — cheeseburgers topped with fried curds, for instance, or brined pork chops glazed with a maple bourbon sauce.

Menu: Lunch and dinner selections include the smoky short rib served atop a bowl of mac and cheese, \$18. For brunch, choose from four different styles of eggs benedict, \$10-\$14.



Frontier Conference Center 350 Biddle Boulevard, Fort Leavenworth (913) 684-3825

The 50,000-square-foot Frontier Conference Center is nestled in the heart of Trails West Golf Course and designed to provide a unique place to conduct larger group functions. The facility has undergone extensive renovations to include a new heating and air conditioning system, state-of-the-art AV equipment, WiFi, complete restroom renovations, new flooring and fresh paint.

Menu: Group luncheons like the American Deli Deluxe Buffet are priced from \$15.64 per person, which includes taxes and room rental fees. Breakfast spreads and boxed lunches also are available; contact the CVB for more info.

DAY 1

Arrive in LEAVENWORTH, KANSAS.


Noon-1:00 p.m.: Lunch served by the "Harvey Girls" at the Riverfront Community Center, which is housed in a renovated 1888 Union Depot, *from \$15.25*, ask for menu. The "Possum Holler Four," a barbershop quartet dressed as convicts, is available to sing for your group, *\$40*.

1:15-2:15 p.m.: Guided tour of Fort Leavenworth, the oldest active fort west of the Mississippi River, \$40 per group. Meet Buffalo Soldier re-enactors to discuss the cavalries' legacy, prices upon request.

NOTE: Picture ID required to enter Fort Leavenworth.

2:15-3:15 p.m.: Self-guided tour of the Frontier Army Museum, suggested donation of \$4 per person.

3:15-4:15 p.m.: Guided tour of the Richard Allen Cultural Center. Learn about the impact African-Americans had in the city, Fort Leavenworth and beyond. View the Black Dignity Portrait Collection and find out about Leavenworth's Underground Railroad connections.



4:30-5:45 p.m.: Check into your hotel with a reception of cookies, punch and coffee <u>or</u> goodie bags when booking a block of 20 rooms or more.

6:00-7:00 p.m.: Dinner at "the little steakhouse across from the Big House," Metropolitan Steak House, 1501 Metropolitan Ave. Enjoy a 10 oz. KC strip with a side salad, Texas toast and your choice of potato and extra veggie, *from \$26*.

NOTE: Local theater productions are available certain dates at the 1930s Art Deco Theatre located in our historic downtown area, \$12 per person in groups of 8 or more.

DAY 2

8:00-9:00 a.m.: Continental breakfast at your hotel. Your step-on guide for the day will join you afterward.

9:00-10:00 a.m.: Guided tour of Leavenworth, the "First City of Kansas," **\$40 flat fee.** Your group will see all the sites, including the "Big House," though the prison is drive-by only.

10:15-11:30 a.m.: Tour the Carroll Mansion, built in 1867. The mansion boasts beautiful stained glass windows, elaborately carved woodwork and Victorian-era furnishings and fashions, *\$10 per person*.

11:45 a.m.-12:45 p.m.: Lunch at The Depot, named for its 1887 Santa Fe Depot building at 781 Shawnee St. Bacon-wrapped meatloaf, mashed potatoes and brown gravy, crispy Brussel sprouts, \$13.

1:00-2:45 p.m.: Tour of the C.W. Parker Carousel Museum. Feel like a kid again with a ride on an original 1913 Parker carousel, \$6 per person or \$5 per person for groups of 20 or more.

3:00-4:30 p.m.: Shopping in historic downtown Leavenworth.

NOTE: Some prices are subject to change, please call ahead.

"River Connection" Itinerary

The rich history and heritage of Leavenworth and Fort Leavenworth is closely tied to its sister river towns of Atchison, KS, and Weston, MO. Located just 45 minutes northwest of Kansas City, MO, these three communities are eager to share their warm hospitality and unique history and heritage.

Be prepared to "step back in time" to the 19th century and learn how our forefathers played roles in the development of the western United States.

DAY 1

Arrive in Leavenworth.

Noon-1 p.m.: Lunch at the River front Community Center, a restored 1888 Union Depot, served by the "Harvey Girls," from \$15.25 per person (tax & tip included). There will be photo opportunities for everyone behind a booth resembling a Leavenworth jail. A barbershop quartet, "The Possum Holler Four," can sing for your group during the meal, \$40.

1-2 p.m.: Tour the C. W. Parker Carousel Museum and then take a ride on an original 1913 Parker carousel, \$6 per person, or \$5 per person for groups of 20 or more.

2:15-3:15 p.m.: Shopping in Leavenworth's historic downtown, with 28 blocks of boutiques, salons, cocktail bars and more. Stop by The Cheeky Llama Clothier to browse its selection of Leavenworth souvenirs, including magnets!

3:15-4:30 p.m.: Tour the Carroll Mansion, built in 1867. This Victorian boasts beautiful stained glass windows and elaborately carved woodwork, *\$10 per person*.

4:30-5:45 p.m.: Guided tour of the "First City of Kansas," **\$40 flat fee**. Your step-on guide will meet you at the Carroll Mansion.

6 p.m.: Check into your hotel. Groups booking 20 rooms or more are met with a minireception where they will be greeted by a CVB staff member thanking you for spending some "time" in Leavenworth!

6:30-7:30 p.m.: Dinner at Luigi's, 418 Cherokee St., *entrees from \$9-\$24 per person*.

After dinner your group can go for a stroll at the Leavenworth Landing Park, which runs along the Missouri River, or possibly attend a play at the 1930s Art Deco Theater in the historic riverfront downtown, \$12-15 per person. (Find a schedule of upcoming performances at www.rccplv.com.)

DAY 2

8-9 a.m.: Continental breakfast at your hotel. Your step-on guide for the day will join you.

9:15-11:30 a.m.: Guided tour of historic Fort Leavenworth, \$40 flat fee.

- Stop to view the Buffalo Soldier Monument site
- Self-guided tour of the Frontier Army Museum, *suggested donation of \$4 per person*

NOTE: <u>Picture ID required to enter Fort</u> Leavenworth.

11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.: Lunch at the Solarium Buffet located inside the Frontier Conference Center, 350 Biddle Boulevard, Fort Leavenworth. Open on Tuesday and Fridays only, *from \$8.95-\$14.95 per person*. Catering is available throughout the week for larger groups — menus available upon request.

12:45-1:15 p.m.: Travel to Atchison, KS.

1:30-5 p.m.: Guided tour of Atchison followed by a visit to the Atchison County Museum, located within a restored railroad depot, and a tour of aviator Amelia Earhart's birthplace. If your group would like to embrace the spirit of "spooky season," consider a tour of Atchison's haunted tourist attractions; the infamous Sallie House, for instance, is a top destination for fans of the paranormal! (Contact visitatchison.com for pricing information and booking.)

Overnight in Atchison, KS.

DAY 3

8-9 a.m.: Continental breakfast at your hotel.

9:15-10:15 a.m.: Your guided tour continues as it heads east and into Missouri.

10:15-10:35 a.m.: Travel to Weston, MO, a small historic town with 22 city blocks listed on the National Register.

10:35 a.m.-12:30 p.m.: Activities available include shopping in Weston's small but historic downtown; popular shops here are dedicated to locally made art and hand-crafted pottery from Poland. Your group also can book a guided walking tour or museum tour.

12:30-1:30 p.m.: Stop for lunch at American Bowman's Restaurant, call (816) 640-5235 to make reservations or to inquire about pricing.

Return to Interstate 29 or Interstate 35 and head to your next destination!


DAY 1

Arrive in LEAVENWORTH, KANSAS.

Noon-1:15 p.m.: Meal served by the "Harvey Girls" at the Riverfront Community Center housed in the renovated 1888 Union Depot located adjacent to the Missouri River, *from \$15.25 per person (tax & tip included)*.

1:20-2:30 p.m.: Guided tour of the Richard Allen Cultural Center, 412 Kiowa St., a museum that explores African-American history and culture both locally and nationally, *\$6 per person*. Your step-on guide for the day will join your group afterward, when you depart for Fort Leavenworth.

NOTE: Picture ID required to enter Fort Leavenworth.



3:15-4 p.m.: Self-guided tour of the Frontier Army Museum, suggested donation of \$4 per person.

4-5:30 p.m.: Guided tour of Fort Leavenworth with a special emphasis on the Buffalo Soldier cavalries and the role they played at the fort, \$40 per hour.

5:30-6:45 p.m.: Groups booking 20 rooms or more are met with a mini-reception where they will be greeted by a CVB staff member thanking you for choosing Leavenworth!

7:00 p.m.: Dinner at Island Spice Jamaican Restaurant, 325 Delaware St. Individual meals, including jerk chicken platters priced from \$16.50, and group catering options are available.

DAY 2

8-9 a.m.: Continental breakfast at your hotel.

9:15-10:15 a.m.: Guided tour of Leavenworth, the "First City of Kansas," with an emphasis on African-American influences including Underground Railroad sites, \$40 per hour.

10:30-11:30 a.m.: Shopping in historic downtown Leavenworth.

11:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.: Dine on your own downtown! Lunch options in downtown Leavenworth include Luigi's 418 Italian Restaurant and Bar, 418 Cherokee St.,; The Depot 1887, with salads, sandwiches and burgers at 781 Shawnee St.; and Tampico Mexican Restaurant, 215 Delaware St.

1:15-2:30 p.m.: Tour of the C. W. Parker Carousel Museum. Feel like a kid again with a ride on an original 1913 Parker carousel, \$6 per person or \$5 per person for groups of 20 or more.

2:45-4:00 p.m.: Tour the Keleher Learning Commons at the University of Saint Mary, where special collections include an extensive selection of scripture and an exhibit dedicated to Abraham Lincoln, *free to schedule but advance notice is required.*
